Brenda Huang, winner of the prestigious 1991 Gilmore Young Artist Award, immigrated from Taiwan to the Chicago area at the age of nine, and had principally studied with Emilio del Rosario, Russell Sherman, and Carolyn McCracken-Forough. She has performed as a soloist with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. Illinois Philharmonic, Toledo Symphony, Milwaukee Symphony, Taipei Symphony, Taiwan Symphony. Ms. Huang was the first prizewinner of the New York Kosziuszko Chopin Competition, the national winner of the Music Teachers National Association (MTNA), an American Pianist Association finalist, and was chosen to represent the United States at the International Chopin Competition in Warsaw by the National Chopin Foundation in Miami. She has performed on the Sunday Piano Series at the Conservatory of Music at Kansas City, the Dame Myra Hess Concert Series at the Chicago Cultural Center broadcasted live on WFMT, the Young Artist Series

broadcasted on New York City radio station WQXR, the Chicago Steinway Society Concert Series, and among many others, at the Polish Cultural Center in New York City, the Isabella Gardner Museum in Boston, the Rudolph Ganz Recital Hall and the Harold Washington Library in Chicago, and solo recitals in Taiwan.

She received her B.A., M.A., and Artist Diploma from the New England Conservatory and at the College of Performing Arts of Roosevelt University. She was a member of the piano faculty at the Chicago Institute of Music in Winnetka. Currently, she maintains a vibrant independent studio at her home in Palatine.

AIM - January 2023 Score Article

Since the last report in November, AIM has successfully opened and closed the 2023 Theory Exam registration using the new Member Portal.

We had 591 students register for this event at Levels 3-12.

- In-Person: 375 (63%)
- Remote: 216 (37%)

Further breakdown:

NU: 389

- In Person: 254 (65%)
- Remote: 135 (35%)

LF: 202

- In Person: 121 (60%)
- Remote: 81 (40%)

We are looking forward to the 2023 Theory Exams on January 22 and 29th, which will be the first Theory exams back in-person since the pandemic.

The Member Portal has made relaying information very easy for teachers. Scheduling details have been released via email.

Teachers: Please remind your in-person students to bring:

- 1. A personal device such as a phone or a tablet and headphones or earbuds to take the Aural Skills exam (a web-based platform). Do not use a school iPad, which may limit internet access outside the school system.
- 2. Transposition music (Levels 4-12 only). This will either be their copy of the AIM Workbook or other book from which the transposition piece was chosen.

Just a reminder that exam sheets will be returned (either remotely or by snail mail) after the 2nd exam date (Jan 29th). Teachers are responsible for grading and tabulating their students' final scores and then entering those scores into the Member Portal. Answer keys will be provided.

SONATA-SONATINA FESTIVAL

Online registration for the 2023 Sonata-Sonatina Festival is now closed, and we are working on scheduling all participants. Your student's schedules should be posted in the Member Portal by the end of January. You will also be receiving your volunteer assignments shortly.

Just a friendly reminder that all teachers who enter students are expected to help on the day of the festival. No substitutes (parents, students, relatives, etc.) are allowed to replace teacher volunteers for their required job.

Students must provide judges with a clean unmarked copy of the music, using the same edition that the student uses, with measure numbers marked at the beginning of every system. NO PHOTOCOPIES ARE ALLOWED. Students who bring in illegal photocopies will receive no scores.

For any students using legally downloaded computer-printed scores, an adult over the age of 18 will be required to sign a Music Release Form which will be provided on Festival Day.

The Gold Medal Recitals will be held on Sunday, February 19, 2023, at 1:00 and 2:30 PM at the Trinity United Methodist Church, 1024 Lake Ave, Wilmette, IL.

Students should plan to wear a face mask at all times while inside the Music Institute of Chicago, including while they are playing.

Member Portal

Since the November meeting, the Member Portal has been hard at work supporting the AIM and SSF events.

We are happy to report that all but 8 NSMTA Members have verified and registered their Member Accounts.

AIM:

- Many of the AIM Teachers had already set up their Student Rosters, and had an easy time registering and making their payments. Any reported bugs in the system were resolved immediately.
- The Portal received and tracked all incoming payments and was able to receive payments from the area Music Schools who make payments on behalf of their students.
- The built-in email system allowed teachers to relay schedule information to their students with the click of a button.
- For the coordinators, the Member Portal is keeping the data organized and easily accessible. There is a lot of behind the scenes manual work that has virtually been eliminated because the Member Portal is managing it for us.

SSF:

- This event prompted the members who hadn't verified and registered their Member Portal accounts to finish that process.
- Next step is to create the SSF schedule and then Teachers will be able to relay their student schedules easily (as with AIM Exams)
