AIM News

With another successful year of **in-person** and **remote** AIM exams, it was decided that NSMTA will continue to offer both options, but with a few modifications. While some of the safety threat of COVID-19 has diminished and many events have returned strictly in person, we feel that offering remote options has advantages for students and teachers that may go beyond for safety reasons. However, please be prepared to be flexible, should the need arise for any last-minute changes.

Be on the lookout for the **2023-24 AIM Packet** to be released on our website in the coming weeks: <u>www.nsmta.org/aim</u> All members must have paid dues by October 31, 2023 in order to enroll students in AIM this year.

AIM registrations will look similar to last year, with the use of Member Portal and Event Portal as the means to register students, retrieve schedules and enter scores as applicable.

Similar to AIM Exams from last year:

- Students entering at levels 3-12 may choose either **in-person** or **remote** option for Theory and Performance exams and are not required to stick with the same format for both exams.
- Remote level 3-12 Theory exams will be administered via Zoom and email correspondence.
- Remote level 3-12 Performance exams will be submitted as pre-recorded videos arranged in a YouTube Playlist and scanned sheet music in Google Drive folder.

Modifications to AIM Exams from last year:

- Level 3-12 **in-person** Theory and Performance Exams will only be offered on one of the exam dates at Lake Forest for Lake Forest Area teachers and students, due to the smaller size and need. (Both **in-person** exam dates will be offered at Northwestern for Northwestern Area teachers and students)
- Level 1-2 AIM Exams will only be offered in-person on one exam date: March 3

All AIM Exam dates and locations can be viewed on the website.

The extended October pre-meeting program will focus on AIM, which will be a combination informational meeting for potential new teachers to AIM, and Q & A for returning teachers. We hope you can join us then.

We look forward to another successful year of AIM exams!

Oakton Six Piano Ensemble Auditions

Be part of a unique musical experience as a member of the Oakton Six Piano Ensemble. Auditions for this internationally acclaimed touring group are scheduled on **Tuesday, September 19, Wednesday, September 20, and Thursday, September 21 at Oakton College** (1600 East Golf Road, Des Plaines) or if the pianist prefers, the audition can be held Online. The group performs repertoire from the classical, ragtime, jazz, and popular periods that is transcribed for the six pianos by the ensemble's founder and conductor, Glenna Sprague, Professor and Coordinator of Music at Oakton, where she also teaches piano. Performing with a conductor, the rich layered sound of the Six Piano Ensemble is comparable to that of an orchestra, with each member playing a different part of a composition as the melody transfers from pianist to pianist. The ensemble provides an excellent opportunity for those pianists who do not want to perform as soloists, but want to keep up their playing skills and be part of an ensemble situation.

The group has performed both internationally and throughout the United States, including the World Conference of the International Society for Music Education (ISME) at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in Glasgow; College Music Society International Conference in Vienna, Austria; Hawaii Music Teachers Association in Honolulu; MTNA National Conferences in Atlanta and Spokane, numerous MTNA state conferences, GP3 National Conference at University of Oklahoma; Steinway of Chicago Community Concert Series, Navy Pier, Civic Opera House, and the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy in Chicago.
